## Snake Bite Kit



If snakes are likely to be a work place issue/family concern where you live or in your area of business operations it is necessary to be aware and more importantly, be prepared.

Snakes are certainly an issue particularly with our grandchildren regularly visiting the rural location where we live. We ensure that they are well educated about snake danger and should a bite be experienced a bite kit is close by supported by a well thought out emergency response plan.

Our primary concerns where we live are listed below in order of concern...

- ① Tiger Snakes (evil as they will go after people)
- ② Brown Snakes (a seriously significant concern)
- ③ Red Bellied Black (generally avoid people)

We purchased a few of these kits a couple of years ago and have them...

- in both the Landcruiser & Polaris farm ute
- on the tractor
- on the ride-on mower
- hanging on the wall under the patio
- hanging in the farm shed workshop
- hanging in the wood shed
- + spares for fitting to belt when bush walking  
*(a bonus is that we found these to be considerably cheaper than most, if not all - available on the www)*

To the date of writing this alert we have had no reason to action our snake bite emergency plan and are very pleased about that!
